An estimated 5,000 people ranging in age from 3 to 73 stroll through the booths on Saturday and Sunday. Last year a total of 128 entries were received from 4 th thru 12 th graders from throughout Shiawassee County including Chesaning and Ovid. The SAGA committee is expecting even more this year. Prizes are awarded to 1 st and 2 nd place winners in three separate divisions along with an overall winner and honorable mention winners.
